DIFFERENT KIND OF ROADS NEEDED

Advent of Motors Has Changed Construction Plans. ENGINEER EXPLAINS

Addresses Meeting of Union of Municipalities.

SHAWINIGAN FALLS, Que., August 30.—The change in the method of constructing roads necessitated by the advent of the automobile, was discussed at the annual convention of the Union of Canadian Municipalities, which opened here this morning by Gordon Grant, chief engineer highways branch, of the department of railways and canals, Ottawa.
