#### Titanic Goes Down With 1,300 Lives.

New York, April 15—The greatest marine disaster in the history of the world occurred last Sunday night, when the Titanic, of the White Star Line, the largest and finest of steamships, shattered herself against an iceberg and sank with

herself against an iceberg and sank with 1,300 of her passengers and crew in less than four hours.

Out of nearly 2,200 people that she carried, only 866 were sayed, and most of these were women and children. They were picked up from small boats by the Cunarder Carpathia, which tound, when she ended her desperate race against time, a sea strewn with the wreckage of the lost ship and the hodies of drowned the lost ship and the bodies of drowned men and women.
