Washington, May 30.—The Senate passed the Underwood Bill revising the metal schedule of the Payne-Aldrich taiff law. The vote was 35 to 22. The bill undoubtedly will be adopted, and the measure was sent to the White House.

Holt, executive agent of the Canadian Northern Railway, is advised that a steamer with a cargo of 500 tons of rails for the Pacific section of the road will sail next month.from Sydney, Cape Breton, for Port Mann.
