However, owing to impurities in commercial lime, it oe necessary if good, fresh burnt as much as was at first recommended red to one could rest assured that 1 pound to five gallons (50 pounds) would be ample, and that the result ing lime water would be thoroughly saturated. The method of preparation

is simply to slake the lime with a small quantity of water and then stir the milk of the lime so formed into 5 gallons of water. After the mixture has been kept well stirred for a few hours it is allowed to settle. The supernatant liquid, which is now saturated lime water, is drawn off and poured over the eggs previously placed in a crock or water-tight barrel. As exposure to the air tends to pre

cipitate the lime (as carbonate), and Dr. F. S. Anderson thus weaken the solution, the vessel containing the eggs should be kept covered. The air may be excluded by a covering of sweet oil, or by slacking upon which a paste of lime is spread.
