HEALTH AND HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

BENEFICIAL FOODS

Lettuce is useful to those suffering from insomnia.

Cranberries are used, externally as well as internally for erysipelas.

Honey is wholesome, strengthening, cleansing, healing and nourishing.

Fresh ripe fruits are excellent for purifying the blood and toning up the system.

Lemons aftord relief to feverish thirst in sickness, for billiousness, low fevers, rheu-matism, colds, coughs, liver complaint, etc.

Celery is invaluable as a food for those suffering from any form of rheumatism; for disease of the nerves and for nervous dyspepsia.

Tomatoes are a powerful aperient for the liver, and are invaluable in all condi-tions of the system in which the use of calomel is indicated.

Onlons are useful in cases of nervous prostration, and will quickly relieve and tone up a worn-out system. Onlons are also useful in all cases of coughs, colds, and influenza.

Apples are nutritious, medicinal, and vitalizing, they aid digestion, clear the voice and correct the acidity of the stomach. An apple contains as much nourishment as a potato in a piessanter and more wholesome

Raw beef proves a great benefit to persous of frail constitution, and to those suf-fering from consumption. It is chopped fine, seasoned with sait and heated by placing it in a dish in hot water. It assimitates rapidly and furnishes the best of nourishment.

Eggs contain a large amount of nutri-ment in a compact, quickly available form. Beaten up raw with sugar, they are used to clear and strengthen the voice. With sugar and lemon juice the beaten white of egg is used to relieve hoarseness.

Breakfast Fruit Cake.—One pound cold boiled potatoes mashed smooth; add one pound flour; half pound finely chepped suet, a little less than half pound of currants and two ounces moist sugar. A teaspoonful of baking powder should be mixed with the flour in its dry state. Roll out the dough to half-inch thickness and bake in a moderate oven. Cut into squares and serve hot.

Leek Soup .- Cut half-dozen leeks in shreds of about three-fourths of an inch, put into a saucepan with four tablespoonfuls of butter, fry for five minutes; add two quarts of siling milk, three raw potatoes cut in small, thin squares; bollone-half hour; add one tablespoonful flour, rubbed in one of butter, two small teaspoonfuls of salt, one teaspoonful of parsley, chopped fue; boil two minutes and serve.

Poached Eggs, Spanish Style.—Heat an earthen dish slowly and melt in it a table-spoonful of butter, add a scant teaspoonful of salt, a smaller quantity of pepper and a small onion, minced very fine; or, instead of onion, use parsley and sweet herbs, or a combination of all together. Drop in six exgs, one at a time; do not stir, but let them brown a little; turn carefully and brown on the other side. Serve in the same dish as bot as possible.

Lunch Rolls.—One quart flour, one-half cake compressed yeast, one tablespoonful sugar, one tablespoonful butter (softened), one teaspoonful salt. First place one plat of sifted flour in bread pan, and pour over about one plat of boiling water; stirr in the butter, salt and sugar. When cool add the yeast, dissolve in one-plat of the plate of th half cup lukewarm water, and the remaining flour. Set to rise overnight. In the morn-ing knead and roll out about one and onehalf inches thick; cut with round or oblong cutter; let get light, then bake twenty-five minutes in moderate oven. Enough for two meals. These are always successful if boiling water is used, and are always sweet, light and delicious.


