UN Official Launch of the International Year of the World's Indigenous People

The Honourable Monique Landry, Minister for External Relations and International Development, and Minister of State for Indian Affairs and Northern Development, introduced today, on behalf of all member countries of the United Nations, the Commemorative Resolution on the International Year of the World's Indigenous People. "The International Year provides Canada and all the co-sponsors with an opportunity to participate in efforts to promote the values, history and aspirations of indigenous people and to further improve international co-operation in the field of human rights," said the Minister.

Canada Calls for Calm in India

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Barbara McDougall, today supported calls for calm by all parties to the Ayodhya controversy in India and a return to peaceful negotiations. "Competing claims over the site of the mosque in Ayodhya have been a divisive and emotional issue in India for some time," said Mrs. McDougall. "Canada supports the Indian government's efforts to have the dispute resolved through negotiation and the court system."

Canadian Nominated to Senior United Nations Environment Post

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Barbara McDougall, said totay that she was very pleased that a.Canadian, Ms. Elizabeth Dowdeswell, had been nominated by the UN Secretary-General to be the new Executive Director of the UN Environment Program (UNEP). Mrs. McDougall said that the General Assembly must endorse the Secretary-General's decision.

STATEMENTS:

These days the pharmaceutical industry can locate its discovery research anywhere in the world. This is both an opportunity and a threat for Canada. Whether or not Canadian troops remain in Cyprus, Greek and Turkish Cypriots bear the ultimate responsibility for resolving the dispute. But it appears that, instead of taking advantage of the peace and order that the UN mission has afforded, some political leaders have used the presence of UN forces to avoid making difficult choices, to avoid making the compromises required to ensure peaceful co-existence. At a time when there are increasing demands for peacekeeping around the world, we must ensure that we establish our priorities carefully, and manage our resources and contributions effectively. Mr. Speaker, in deciding to withdraw our troops, we are not saying that the United Nations should put an end to its peacekeeping mission in Cyprus. That is a matter for the Security Council, the Secretary-General, and the parties involved to consider. With over 4,000 troops participating in peace missions from Cambodia to Bosnia, from Croatia to Central America and the Middle East, the words "Canada" and "peacekeeping" will always be closely associated in the eyes of Canadians and in the eyes of the world.
