Bill read the second time and the house went into committee thereon, Mr. Courtemanche in the chair.

On clause 1-Short title.

Mr. Sinclair: Since the members of the official opposition took ample opportunity when the subject matter was in committee of supply to discuss the items they had in mind we do not intend to prolong the debate by adding anything at this stage of the committee proceedings.

Mr. Harkness: That is wise.

The Chairman: Shall clause 1 carry?

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): May I ask the minister one question? In view of the information that was obtained this afternoon to the effect that certain items in the supplementary estimates last session were actually given legislative effect on a permanent basis by virtue of the wording of the supply bill, may I ask whether there is any such provision in the bill now before us? Are any of these items being given legislative effect beyond the appropriation of money for the current fiscal year?

Mr. Fleming: No. I said a number of times today that no item is finally carried by the present measure at all. With respect to something like 98 per cent of the items it is simply one-twelfth. There are 13 items for which more than one-twelfth of the total item is being asked for and provided for in this bill.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Mr. Chairman, I am afraid the minister did not understand my question. I know the answer that he has now given. He will recall that this afternoon or earlier today I referred to the fact that some items had been passed last session to the extent of only four-ninths. The minister replied that by virtue of the
