Secondly, that no *Englishman* is, or can be taxed, but by the Consent of those Persons, whom he has chose to represent him; for the Truth of this I shall appeal only to the candid Representatives of those unfortunate Counties which produce Cyder, and shall willingly acquiesce under their Determination.

Lastly, that no *Englishman* is, or can be taxed, without the Consent of the Majority of those, who are elected by himself, and others of his Fellow Subjects, to represent them. This is certainly as false as the other two; for every *Englishman* is taxed, and not one in twenty represented: Copyholders, Leaseholders, and all Men possessed of personal Property only, chuse no Representatives; *Manchester, Birmingham,* and
