The Overscers duty.

The Overseer is to direct the Persons within his Division ors; in the performance of the work and duty required by the Act seer. and to prosecute every one who neglects or refuses to perform what the Act requires. He is to enter upon the Duties of his Office on the first day of January and to serve for two years. - twen Sec. 25.

Surveyors duty.

The Grand-Voyer is to nominate and appoint in each Parish, Seigneurie or Township of his District, a Surveyor of Highways and Bridges, who is to enter upon his Office at the periods directed for Overseers, and to serve for two years, during which period he is to superintend and direct the Overseers in their duty, to prosecute every Overseer who shall refuse or neglect his duty—to communicate to them the Grand-Voyer's Orders and to forward such Orders, if required, to the Surveyor of the next Parish. He is also to report, in writing or verbally, to the Grand-Voyer, once in every six months and at the time of his Circuit, the state of the Roads and Bridges within his Parish, &c.—Sec. 26.

Surveyors, who, when appointed, do not accept the office, forfeit four pounds, if they do accept, they forfeit twenty shillings, for every refusal or neglect of duty.—Sec. 26.
