That is its extension to all producers needing it.

As for the intimation that Canadian As for the intimation that Canadian trade will be diverted to England in the event of the refusal of American favors, we are unable to formulate the process. We think that Mr. Davies is in a similar predicament. This commercial movement can only proceed along the lines of an Imperial customs federation and the complete surrender of the free trade principle by England. That will not come in our time. We wish that we could see a way to Canadian reciprocity, but the Canadian propositions lead us up against a wall.


