Lord Lansdowne (the Foreign Minister) said that Canada, Jamaica and the other West Indian Islands, and the Island of Mauritius (in the Indian Ocean, had promised to help with money and goods.

Mr. Joseph Chamberlain has contributed \$250 to the Mansion House West Indian relief fund.



CHAMBERLAIN SENDS EXPERTS TO REPORT ON REQUIREMENTS OF MARKET.

London, May 14.—In consequence of receipt of information regarding the activity of American firms, chiefly engineering, electrical and mining concerns, who are preparing to despatch heavy shipments to South Africa immediately after peace is declared, the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Chamberlain, has authorized the despatch of a commission of experts in engineering, textiles, etc., to traverse the entire country and report immediately on the requirements of South Africa under the new conditions and the openings for British goods.
