

T. AND L. COUNCIL HEARTILY INDORSES INDUSTRIAL BYLAW

Unanimously in Favor of
Guaranteeing Bonds.

AGREEMENT IS EXPLAINED

Delegates Expect Good Results for Organized Labor and Trades.

At the meeting of the trades and labor council last night the bylaw authorizing the guarantee of the bonds of the Ajax Rubber Company of Canada by the city received the unanimous indorsement of the delegates of the various local unions attending.

The proposition was thoroughly explained to them by George Miller of the Ajax Company. Controller Shaw and Industrial Commissioner Philip.

Dr. Shaw explained in detail the agreement by which the city given bonds.

The Ajax Company, besides being required to build and equip a plant capable of turning out 500 tires per day, costing a minimum of \$300,000, is also to deposit with a trust company a sufficient sum to pay off the bonds when they fall due.

E. Ingles favored the proposition, and declared that as far as he could see the city would be getting a substantial boon to organized labor, as well as better conditions for trades connected with the building and construction of factories.

George Miller, the company's representative in London, dwelt briefly upon the labor side of the proposition. He said that the company's employees would practically all be selected from London, only the heads of the various departments being imported, in case men with the necessary experience and knowledge of the scientific departments are not to be found in the city.

"We are required to spend a minimum of \$300,000 on the plant," he said, "before the guarantee can be granted. Before the guarantee is granted, we are required to spend at least one million dollars before a start can be made."

Industrial Commissioner Philip declared that a similar plant erected in Brockville, with a like capacity, cost \$700,000. "However," he added, "the estimate of the expense of the Ajax Company is not conservative. The advertising campaign must be approved by two members of the board of control," he added.

A vote of the ratifiers on the bylaw authorizing the city guarantee the bonds to the extent of \$450,000, will be taken on July 20.

MOST BEAUTIFUL OF IRIS FAMILY ON EXHIBITION AT THE PUBLIC LIBRARY

There is Talk of Starting Iris Kaempfer Club in City.

Specimens of Iris Kaempfer, or Japanese Iris, the largest and most beautiful of this family of flowers, are on exhibition at the public library, 5 Wood, being from the garden of S. Wood. In Japan these flowers are grown largely in the garden of the fields and attain a breadth of 10 and 12 inches to the bloom in such colors as white, purple, deep blue and violet with beautiful veining. They come in great numbers, and are planted in the garden of the Kaempfer, the plants are best put in the ground in August or the beginning of September, in order that they may root before frost, otherwise they are liable to be heaved out in the spring. They are also planted in the spring with success. The secret of success is to give them a well stirred, never allowing it to bake or grow hard. They like plenty of moisture in summer, but this is not necessary, as many suppose, and water should not stand over the roots in winter. They can be grown in a pot in any well drained loam if it is well enriched. There are Iris Kaempfer clubs with exhibitions held every year. It has been proposed that such a club be formed in London, and any who are interested may leave their names at the public library.
