

HOUSE AND STORE REPLACE OLD FARM

"Old Dutch" Property Being
Rapidly Built Upon—Land-
marks Have Disappeared.

The Old Dutch Farm of 76 acres, lying East of Danforth avenue, between Coxwell and Woodbine avenues, owing to the rapid development of the eastern section is being steadily transformed into a street of solidly-built houses. At the present rate of progress the farm will in a short time be a memory to the large majority of citizens. Many still remember the popular Dutch Farm Hotel, which stood on the property on road, and was a favorite place of call for refreshments and social gatherings in by-gone days. The Dutch Farm Hotel in the year 1850 was kept by Mrs. J. L. Coxwell, who was assisted by his housekeeper, and sister-in-law, Mrs. W. H. Coxwell. The property was rented from the Church of England synod, the owners of the property. The property was the house was such that people came from all parts of the city to the Dutch Farm to enjoy the good cheer provided by the genial landlord and to partake of the famous brown bread and sausage served by Mrs. W. H. Coxwell. According to J. B. Harris, a prominent Danforth resident, it was quite a customary thing to see as many as fifty guests at a time huddled up on a Sunday afternoon in the summer time at the Old Dutch Farm, while the visitors enjoyed themselves to their hearts' content in the shady garden at the rear of the hotel. Mr. Harris recalled the story of a well-known citizen leaving the hotel on a certain Christmas Eve with a fat goose surviving at his home in Todmorden was surprised to find on opening his parcel that his Christmas dinner had been removed and three geese substituted. The hotel and adjoining property were destroyed by fire about twenty years ago, and a block of business premises and apartments built near the site of the old buildings by the late Jerry Nelson, who was killed shortly afterwards on the Don Mills road. 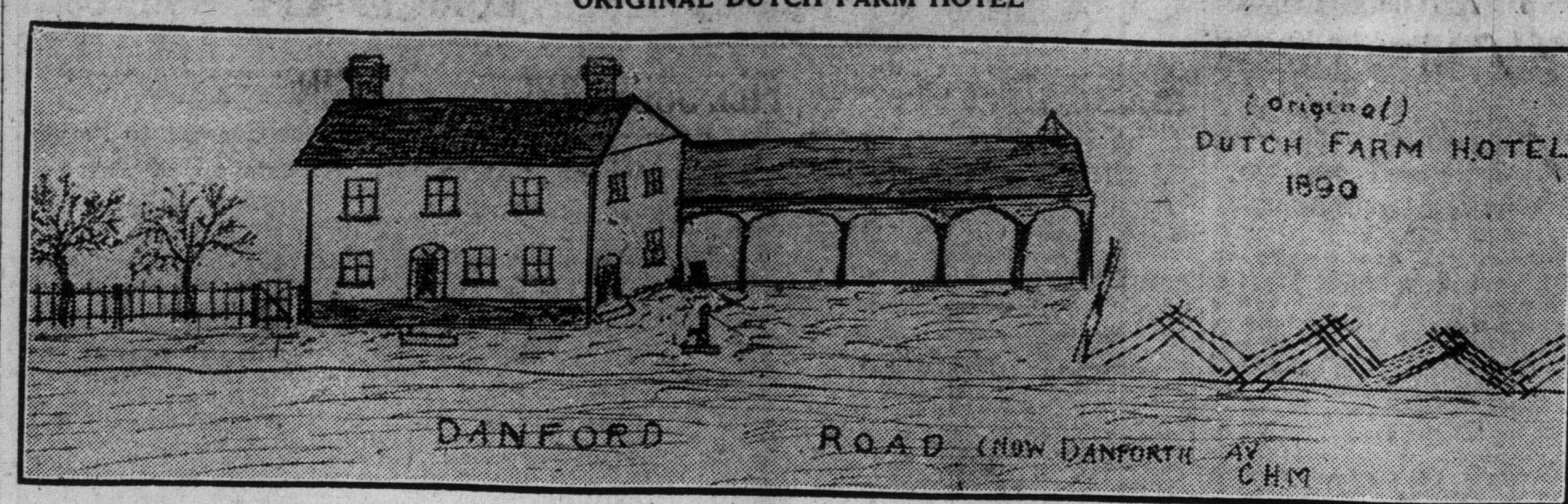

PROPOSE TO CREATE TWO TOWNSHIPS

"It shall be the duty of the corporation of the Township of York within five weeks after the passing of this act to submit to the municipal electors in that part of the township lying north of the Lawrence side road and McDougall avenue the following question:

"Are you in favor of the incorporation of that part of the Township of York lying north of the Lawrence side road and McDougall avenue as the Township of North York?"
