##### Question No. 2,744—Mr. McKenzie:

1. Did the Post Office Department commission an advertising agency to produce the brochure and postal code stickers "2 ways you can help yourself to better mail service" and, if so, what was the (a) cost (b) name and address of the firm?

2. (a) What was the printing cost (b) how many were produced (c) what was the total cost (including printing, production, distribution, etc.)?

3. What was the name and address of the firm that was contracted to produce the brochure and stickers?

**Hon. J.-J. Blais (Postmaster General):** 1. (a) and (b) The creative aspects of the national postal householder package

[Mr. Goodale.]

(brochure and postal code sticker sheets) were developed under contract with B & B Advertising Ltd., 1010 St. Catharine Street W., Montréal, Quebec. Cost: \$11,400\*.

2. (a) and (b) Overall production of the householder was handled through the Department of Supply and Services contracts, after the normal procedure of bidding and tendering. Seven and one-half million householders were produced. Itemized contract costs are as follows: envelope—\$63,630.00; brochure—\$69,503.98; stickers—\$70,371.75; mailing preparation—\$33,750.00; and primary distribution—\$11,400.00\*. (c) Total cost—\$248,655.73.

3. Printing production of the brochure was awarded under DSS contract to: Gazette Canadian Printing Ltd., 1000 St. Antoine St., Montreal, Quebec H3C 3R7. Similarly, contract for production of the stickers was awarded to: Southam Printing Ltd., Specialty Division, P.O. Box 1079, Montreal, Quebec H3C 2X6.
