ANOTHER SAD CASE COMES UNDER THE NOTICE OF THE CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY

In connection with a case which is to come before Chief Justice McKewen tomorrow under the Children's Protection Act, it was necessary to summon a woman who lived near Miramichi, having removed from the city some months ago. At the request of Rev. W. R. Robinson, secretary of the Children's Aid Society, Constable Constable Saunders went yesterday to serve the notice. On arrival at the shack he found windows broken and men and women in the first room he entered had a floor of poles. The next contained a half-starved horse, covered with some old, ragged carpet. There was apparently no fodder for the animal. The next room contained an old stove with the bottom of a cast-iron for a cover, a table and two benches. There was no food except a piece of hard-baked and a few pounds of flour. The only other room contained an old wooden bed, with a dirty old mattress, three blankets and four dirty pillows. A woman and two children, a girl of twelve or thirteen and one of three, were in the house. They were almost naked, and very dirty. The man had run away to the nearby woods, but when called by Constable Saunders he came back with blankets and brought them to the Children's Home in Elliott row. Unfortunately the house was full, and it was necessary to make other provision for them until today. This man and woman are not married.
