GERMAN COMMENT ON  
CHANGE IN COMMANDLondon, Dec. 21.—German newspapers  
for the most part seem to be uncertain  
how to view the appointment of Gen-  
eral Sir Douglas Haig as British com-  
mander-in-chief in place of Field Mar-  
shal Sir John French. Comment from  
two Berlin newspapers, however, is
