Message from Egypt Received for First Time at Leaford, Oxford.

London, April 27.—The first eastward link in the British Imperial wireless chain has been forged. Wireless messages were received from Egypt at the post office station at Leaford, Oxfordshire, and hence sent to the Central Telegraph Office, London. It is intended that Imperial wireless will ultimately be extended over the whole British Empire.

The service inaugurated today is based on a charge of nine-pence per word to Egypt, as against one shilling per word by ordinary telegraph routes, and for the present telegrams to places beyond Egypt are charged three-pence below the ordinary rates for full rate telegrams and ten-pence half-penny below for deferred telegrams.

Special arrangements for press messages have been made at a rate of two-pence half-penny per word for northern Egypt and three-pence half-penny per word for Palestine. The service will aim to accelerate the transmission of telegrams to and from London and the Near East.

of fishermen, there will be more spawn killed than ever through the recession of the water. President R. J. Soden, of the Game and Fish Protective Association, places the loss at ninety per cent. The Ontario Game and Fish Protective Association is confident that the erection of dams at the head of the creeks and bays is the logical means to protect the spawn. These dams would be closed at this time of the year, and the water would be kept up. The young fish, when hatched in June and July, would be released through special chambers. As it is now, the spawn is left high and dry in fields and woods.
