THEFTS OF PLATINUM

Enormous thefts of platinum, accounted for by the present standards of value as more precious than gold, are being reported from the chemical laboratories and manufacturers of the United States. The stealing of \$50,000 worth of the valuable metal from the plant of a large New Jersey chemical firm a few days ago has been followed by many other losses. The situation is so serious as to cause warnings and notices to be distributed throughout the country. Members of the American Chemical Society, through the various sections, have been informed of the wholesale thefts and descriptions of the stolen articles made of platinum are being forwarded to the secretaries of the sections of the organization with requests to keep a sharp lookout for all platinum peddlers. It is announced in the current number of the Journal of Industrial and Engineering Chemistry that the vault of the Department of Agricultural Chemistry at the University of Missouri was entered and the entire stock of platinum crucibles, amounting to 2,500 grams in weight, had been stolen. Other university laboratories have had the same bitter experience. Aside from its growing use by jewelers for rings and settings for diamonds and other precious stones, platinum is essential to many chemical tests and processes and is therefore high in price.
