"The old street has not changed such," he said as he stood in front of the house which had been his home for tany years. "That old public house on the corner looks exactly as it did when used to listen to the crowd of old gar-makers discussing politics there in the evening when I was a mere slip of boy."

A woman of over eighty years, wearig a long gray shawl, hobbled up, look-d at the stranger a moment, and then the lock-in:

"I know you, Sam Gompers," she said.
Many's the time I gave you a piece of my mind when you used to live here," pointig to the house where he was born. The old woman had not seen him since he left London as a youthful apprentice cigar-maker. He spent some ninutes talking over old times with her, sking about various boyhood play-

nates, most of whom have been dead ong since.

Mr. Gompers spent a very happy half our in the midst of the crowd of men, romea and children, many of them hildren and grandchildren and even reat-grandchildren of persons whom he membered as neighbors of his father and mother.
