





work. Bacon's experience is in sharp contrast to that of the late Edward A. Abbey, an American painter who was commissioned to prepare the official canvas of King Ed-ward's coronation. Abbey has left on re-cord an account of the immense difficulties he had to overcome in completing his great picture. Peers and peeresses are said to have openly rebelled against sitting to him and it is recalled that there was consider-able feeling against the commission being given to a foreigner when there were so many English painters almost as well qual-fied to do the work. Abbey is said to have been offered a similar honor by King George, but turned it down as politely as possible.




