(Continued from page 1) There are sometimes in our part more than 1,500 men who go down to the sea in ships. Many and grievous are the temptations which they are exposed, and it might well be expected that a goodly number of them would be found in the police court charged with offences. I am in a position to state that very few, indeed, are found in our court. What is the explanation? There are absolutely no restraining influences or sympathetic expressions, especially extended to protect and help the sailor, in our city except those offered by our mission. The men by hundreds are taking advantage of the provisions made for them. They enjoy the good services, concerts, religious exercises, and the privilege of writing to their friends, and look upon the place as their home, where they can be found any night in large numbers.
