- (g) Dairy Management.
- (h) Management of Landlet Property; Principles of the Lease; Theory of Rent; Relation of Political Economy to rural affairs.
- (i) Agriculture as a pursuit; economic importance of; its place in a system of general education; tendency to foster feelings of Patriotism.

The Professors of Chemistry, of Natural History (including Botany and Entomology,) and of Mineralogy and Geology, will give Special Lectures on these branches relating to Scientific Agriculture which comes within their respective departments.
