At the meeting of the City Council yesterday Commissioner McLellan submitted the balance of his report dealing with the services administered by the Department of Public Safety The report, in part, was as follows: This Department, with the equip work as can be expected. The condi-tions which the Fire Department of St. John have to contend with are not equaled in any city in Canada. Over head wires strung here and there for free conditions, and an obsolete aerial ladder truck which cannot be placed so as to decrease the difficulties met with in overhead wires, affords a most hazardous condition concern-ing the safety of lives and property, when fires occur above the first floor. The addition of motor apparatus is absolutely necessary, and particular.


