Was Not Bound Here
Word has been received from St. John's, Newfoundland, that the schooner John, bound from Cadiz for Newfoundland with salt was abandoned in mid-ocean and the crew saved. The Canadian Press yesterday announced that the crew had landed at Montreal, Me. The despatch was wrong in stating that the John was a barque, that she was bound to St. John, and that her crew was mostly from this port.

Troopships Coming.
The troopship Minnedosa, with troops, civilians, mails and general cargo, for this port, was reported to have sailed from Liverpool yesterday morning.

She will be followed by the Cassandra, which sails from Glasgow on Saturday next.

Loading for South America.
The term schooner Meteghan moved from Hillyard's blocks yesterday afternoon to the Pettibone wharf, to load lumber for Buenos Ayres. The schooner is almost ready to sail, but will wait for the Meteghan, both under the same charter to carry lumber to South America.

Restrictions Removed.
The restrictions which have been imposed upon steam vessels of less than 250 tons, whereby these vessels were prohibited from making trans-Atlantic voyages, have been removed by the United States Shipping Board. An order restricting, dating back to October, 1917, which prohibited sailing vessels from making trans-Atlantic passages, was also removed.

Sailed from Halifax.
The steamer Carib sailed Tuesday afternoon to the Pettibone wharf, to load lumber for Buenos Ayres. The schooner is almost ready to sail, but will wait for the Meteghan, both under the same charter to carry lumber to South America.

From Seykjavik.
The Gullfoss, a Danish steamer, is in the stream at Halifax wharf. She is chartered by the Icelandic government and is on her way to New York from Seykjavik.

The Victory Chimes.
The schooner Victory Chimes has just been launched at Cardigan, P. E. Island, and there is some bustling being done to get her ready and off to sea before the ice forms and prevents her getting away this spring. She is to load produce for St. John's, Nfld., and if she gets to that port a \$50,000 freight awaits her for South America. The steamer Stanley is under orders to tow her to the Strait of Canso if possible.

Govt. Steamer Arammore.
The government steamer Arammore, Captain McDonald, returned to Halifax Sunday, after being practically at sea for 27 days. During the trip she visited Sable Island and landed provisions and supplies. Owing to the very rough weather considerable difficulty was experienced in loading on the island, and a lot of time was consumed before the work was finally accomplished. The Arammore then proceeded to Cape Breton and succeeded in landing supplies at a large number of light houses and fog alarm stations.

The Arammore, which was on the Boston-Yarmouth route for some time, and which gave eminent satisfaction, now being available, will proceed to Yarmouth at once and take up the work, she was to have laid up to undergo a general overhauling, but

London Notes.
London, Jan. 18—Nassau cables that 5,000 packages of canned goods (from str Blandon, before reported stranded on Salt Keys and Bosted) have arrived there. (Str Blandon arrived at New York Jan. 18)

20th—Scho S. N. Castle, from San Francisco Dec 23 for Sydney, N. S. W. has arrived at Hilo, Hawaii.

Norfolk, Va., Jan. 18—Schr Geneva Kathleen, before reported ashore of Cobbs Island, is resting easy and is apparently unharmed with fair weather. It is expected to get her about in a few days.

Disabled Steamer.
Str. Ansaldo III. (Ital), from Philadelphia for Genoa, before reported with rudder disabled, was picked up by str Calabra (Br), Jan. 1, and towed throughout the day, when the lines were dropped by the Ansaldo upon information being received by the captain that the government tug was on the way to her assistance. The disabled steamer was then about 400 miles E of Sandy Hook.

St. John's, Newfoundland
St. John's, Nfld., Jan. 10—Schr Gov. Foss, supposed from Gloucester, arrived here Jan. 6 leaking; a diver patched the leak, but just as the ship was ready for sea Capt. Young became ill and another master was appointed to command the vessel on the voyage. Str. Evanton (Br), before reported in collision, entered dry dock today.

11th—Schr Benevolence (Br), ran ashore outside the piers of Grand Bank and will probably become a total wreck.

Schr Florence Savers dragged in the harbor last night and collided with schr Inspiration (Br). The latter lost jibboom.

THE BARKENTINE

T. H. MACDONALD

New Vessel Arrived Yesterday
—Largest Craft Built in Nova Scotia Since Boom Started—Cost \$160,000.

The barkentine, T. H. Macdonald, which entered this port yesterday from the yards at Meteghan, is an others fine example of the work that is being done in the Nova Scotia yards. She is a four-masted, with 178 foot keel of black birch, Douglas fir keelson on the rails, beams, and cabin ceilings are of Douglas fir and the rest of the finished work is in yellow birch and hardwood. She is 221 feet over all, 178 foot keel, 40 foot beam, has capacity is 10 feet deep and she draws 17 feet of water. She is equipped with 15 h.p. Fairbanks-Morse patent steering gear, a new style capstan, power pumps, and every modern convenience for a sailing ship.

J. B. Robb, of Meteghan, the master builder, is aboard, and says the T. H. Macdonald is the largest vessel built in the province since the boom started. She cost in the yards \$160,000 and a price much higher than that has already been offered the owners, T. H. and W. S. Macdonald, of Meteghan.

The Macdonald was built in nine months by a crew of 45 men, 1,088 registered tonnage, contained in this port to J. T. Knight & Co., and after completing her crew will head many for Buenos Aires and river ports. There is a possibility that she may be sold to the South American trade.
