Several men already have been arrested, one of them charged with having shot and killed a civilian bystander while the police were trying to arrest the accused, who they assert had a hand in the warehouse burnings.

The police are working under a tremendous strain, owing to the influx of desperadoes, some of whom are said to be "gunmen" from the United States, whose exact mission is not known, but whose presence the police believe has an obvious explanation. The entire police force is exerting the greatest activity in an effort to prevent a recurrence of the tres and possible attempts at assessinations.
