their Stock was forfeited and the proceeds credited, and then the action ought to be for the balance remaining unpaid only.

6. That, if good, it did not cure the defection pointed out by the

In answer to the above it was answered by A.L. Palmer, Esq., Q.C., and C. N. Skinner, Esq., Q. C., the Plaintiffs' Counsel, that as to the first point, There was no necessity for all the Stock to be subscribed. To the second, That the calls had been properly made. To the third, That even if it was true that the subscribers had been induced to subscribe, as alleged, this would be no answer to an action against him for calls. So far from that being so, it was a reason why they should pay, as otherwise it would be a fraud on the City and Government. To the fourth, That the remedy by forfeiting the Stock was accumulative only, and the Company had the option to proceed which ever way they choose; that the proceeding by action was more beneficial to the Defendant than forfeiting his Stock and then eing for the balance, as in that case the Stock would sell for little or nothing, and after the Defendent had paid his calls he would not have anything. To the fifth, That the Act of 1869 was not ultra vires, but was within the power of the Local Legislature. And to the sixth, That such Act cured all the defects that the Defendants relied on. The Judges took several terms to consider their judgment, and although they all agreed that the Stockholders were liable to pay the calls, yet they did not all agree that the Stockholders could be sued until their Stock was forfeited and sold, and therefore they each delivered their judgment seriatum. The Chief Justice, Allan and Weldon, Justices, deciding that a Stockholder could only be sued after his Stock had been torfeited, and therefore gave judgment for the Defendant, and Fisher, Justice, deciding that the Company could proceed in either way, and giving his opinion in favor of the Plaintiffs. The following are the texts of the said judgments.
