ANSWER.

1. WILLIAM CROSCOMBE; who was born at Tiverton, England, on the 19th of February, 1789. When about eighteen years of age he first became acquainted with the Methodists, and was deeply convinced of sin. But having no spiritual friends to counsel him he relapsed into carelessness, until about two years after, when, under severe affliction, he began earnestly to seek salvation. At a Sabbath-morning Prayer Meeting he subsequently found mercy, and rejoiced in the liberty of the sons of God. A few months afterwards he was induced by the inward call of the Holy Spirit, and at the solicitation of beloved friends, to exhort sinners to turn to God by sincere repentance. In the discharge of this duty he was honored with success, while the effect upon his own mind was highly beneficial.
