MILITIA GENERAL ORDER, No. 1.

With reference to the G. O No. 1 of the 8th June last, Her Exectlency the Commander in Chief directs that all the Artillery Carbines, Cavalry Swords and Pistols, Rifled and Percussion Musquets, with Bayonets and Accourrements complete of the whole of the Active Force, when not in use under the provisions of the said G. O., shall be kept in the Government Armory at all the stations where there is one, and in private Armories at all the other posts; and His Excellency will hold commanding Officers of Corps, and all others concerned, responsible that this order is carried into effect.

His Excellency is persuaded that the Officers of the Force will see the propriety, and indeed the necessity, of strictly carrying out these

instructions.
