

BISHOP, ARCHIBALD. (*South Huron.*)

B. in Edinburgh, Scot. Ed. in Wiston Parish Sch., Lanarkshire. M. Miss Janet P. Doig, of Huron. Was Reeve of Osborne from 1863 to 1874, and Warden of Huron in 1872-3. First returned to Leg. Assem. on resignation of sitting member, 5 Oct., 1873; re-elected at g. e. 1875, 1879, and 1883, and again at last g. e. A Reformer.—*Exeter, Ont.*

BLEZARD, THOMAS. (*East Peterboro'.*)

B. in Tp. of Otonabee, Co. Peterboro', 24 Nov., 1838. Ed. in the Common Sch. M., 9 Dec, 1865, Mary Meikle. Sat nine years in Tp. Council, and five in Co. Council. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1879, and re-elected at g. e. 1883 and 1886. A Liberal.—*Villiers, P.O., Ont.*

BLYTH, JOHN. (*South Grey.*)

S. of the late Alex. Wright Blyth, who came from Glasgow, Scot., about 1830, and was among the first settlers of Co. of Wellington. B. in Guelph, Co. of Wellington, 4 Oct., 1849, and ed. at the Common Sch. there. M., 1871, to Jane Peteo. Is a farmer, and is Reeve of the Tp. of Normanby. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1883, and re-elected last g. e. A Conservative.—*Orchard, P.O.*

BRONSON, ERSKINE HENRY. (*Ottawa.*)

Eldest s. of H. F. Bronson, Esq., a native of Warren Co., New York State, who settled in Can. 1853. B. at Bolton, Warren Co., in 1844. M. at Norfolk, Virginia, in 1874, the only dau. of Prof. N. B. Webster. Ed. in Ottawa and at Sandy Hill, New York State. Is a mem. of the firm of Bronson and Weston, extensively engaged in the manufacture of sawn lumber. Was a mem. of the City Council of Ottawa for seven years, and a mem. of the School Board of the city for fourteen years. An unsuccessful candidate for Carleton, Ont., in the Commons at g. e. 1882. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Ottawa.*

CHAMBERLAIN, THEODORE F., M.D. (*Dundas.*)
