S. of Col. T. C. W. Daly, who settled in Stratford, Ont., 1832, and was for a quarter of a century agent for the Canada Co., Trust and Loan Co., and late Bank of Upper Canada, and Chief Magistrate for Huron Tract, by Miss Mayne of Coote Hill, Irel. B. in Hamilton, Ont., 17 Feb., 1827. Ed. at Upper Canada College. M. June, 1846, Helen McLaren, dau. of the late Peter Ferguson, Esq., of Stratford. Was a Magistrate and Councillor for Huron Dist., 1847, and Mayor and Reeve of Stratford for several years. Sat for Perth in Can. Assembly from 1854 until 1861, when defeated ; re-elected, July, 1862, and sat until g.e. 1863, when again defeated. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat in House of Commons at g.e. 1867. Returned at last g.e. A
