Nr. Rea. der Rea was appointed Agent for the superintendency of Rawdon, in May 1821, and that he had previously obtained, for himself and a long list of applicants, an Order of Council for grants of 100 acres to each of them, to be located in this Township and in Kildare. Upon that Order several of those individuals were located to lands in Rawdon from this Office; the others received their Location Tickets from Mr. Rea, as Agent, in which capacity he appears to have conducted the settlement of the Township under his inspection with somewhat more regularicapt. Col. ty and system than Captain Colclough, who succeeded to him in 1823. This circumstance may not, however, invalidate the just cause of complaint which has produced Mr. Rea's removal—but, at that time, it was expected the appointment of another Agent would be the means of obviating the difficulties complained of, and introduce more order and harmony and a better understanding amongst the settlers. Although it may be a troublesome and embarrassing task, owing to the description and character of some of the people in that settlement, yet it might and ought to have been effected. shall, without dwelling on this subject, only beg leave to call His Excellency's attention to that part of my former Report from the letter **D** to the description of Rawdon, and also to that part which refers to my Notes on the papers accompanying it, marked 4 and 5.
