happy or whether it's apathy or perhaps a combination of both."

Norris said the Board has dealt with a few day to day issues, discussed rent increases for commercial tenants, and accessibility problems for physically challenged individuals at CHSR-FM. He said other than that, it has been a fairly routine year.

Meanwhile, van Raalte thinks it is time the SUB Advisory Board engages in what he terms "navel gazing."

"Perhaps the Board needs to be backed up by two Student Unions with a renewed commitment to it another year," he said. But he stopped short of calling for a Board re-structuring at this time.

ment," he said. "The Board's major problem is that it has not been involved in any long term planning, but that should change. At the moment the Board is saddled with a certain image. It is simply an Advisory Board with no real decisionmaking power. I'm not sure how seriously it is taken by the administration or even by its members under the circumstances."

"What will have to be determined with SUB Expansion is whether students should get more decision-making power over a building they are helping to finance," said van Raalte. "When the expansion opens that may be the case. If it is, it will be up to student leaders to petition the UNB Board of Governors to change the powers and duties of the SUB Advisory Board," he concluded.
