Sir,

With reference to the practice of funding annuity money, etc, for Indian pupils and others, I beg to say that there are a number of accounts standing open in the savings ledger of the Department which have not been augmented for a length of time. It is proposed to close out all such accounts. I give below a list of the Indians belonging to ~~that~~ your Agency who have savings accounts with the Department which come under this class. You should have these individuals make formal application to the Department, in the usual way, for the withdrawal of the amounts standing respectively at their credit. Of course if any of the depositors desire to have their accounts kept open in order that they may make further deposits there will be no objection on the part of the Department to this being done. The names of the Indians and the amounts in question are as follows:-
