Dear Sir,-

I beg leave to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 27th ultimo, in which you state that His Excellency would be glad to know what is the selling value of land adjoining lots 1 and 2, concession 1, Temiscomingue Reserve, which have been recently surrendered by the Indians to be disposed of for their benefit.

In reply I would say that the adjoining land forms part of the Indian Reserve, and, not having been surrendered for sale, is not in the market.

I may say that, some few years ago, about one-half of this reserve was surrendered by the Indians to be disposed of for their benefit, and the same was subdivided into lots and placed in the hands of the local agent
