Sir,

In regard to report of Fire Ranger that The Standard Chemical Company are cutting under sized timber on Parry Island, I beg to inform you that the Manager of the Company was advised in April last, that the Department sanctioned the reduction of diameter limit from 10 to 6 inches, on the strict understanding that the bush should be properly lumbered, all top branches, &c. being lopped and strown on the ground, and the entire tree utilized.

If there has been any cutting of timber less than 6 inches, the Company should be advised that such cutting was in trespass, and to make a separate Return thereof, and specific instructions given that no more undersized timber be cut, and that if persisted in, the question of cancelling Permit would have to be considered.
