Hon. Sir,

I am directed by the Indians who do not belong to the Allied tribe, or to any organization to ask you Sir as follows -

- 1st. Is it so that the Government of Canada is going to settle with the Indians who belong to the organization only, or to the allied tribes of B.C. only. *no*
- 2nd. Is it so that the Government of Canada will not have anything to do with Indians that never joined the allied tribes. *no*
- 3rd. Is it so when the Government of Canada do pay any money to the Indians of B.C. for title or compensation, those Indians never joined the allied tribes will not get any share. *no*
- 4th. Does the Government recognize their (allied tribe) lawyer O'Meara. *no*
- 5th. When is the Government representative to visit British Columbia Indians again. *not done*
- 6th. Will any Indian or Indians have the liberty to come before said officials. *representative chosen by Indians*
- 7th. What is the findings of the Government for the B.C. Indians for final settlement, as most Indians are relying on the findings of the Royal Commission.

All these are greatly appreciated by answers for the benefit of the Indians. As most of them dont attend meetings of the allied tribes. Given them an answer would give them an idea or enlighten them.
