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...to be based on any reference, with authority to spend the money in any way, even such as an integration. Rejection of integration did not prevent the use of a general education fund for their own use, but in addition was overruled by the Organization in Mr. Stephens' statement, time that could give the least color to such a statement.

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In 1875, on the motion of Sir John A. Macdonald, the salary of the governor of the House of Commons at Ottawa, was raised from \$3,300 to \$4,000 a year.

At the same time the salary of the Speaker of the Senate was also raised from \$2,900 to \$4,000.

Nobody ever said in the field or heard any member of the party say that was a wrong stop, or call upon Parliament to cut down those salaries.

The council at Toronto have, as a rule, during the past few years, been very little shorter than those at Ottawa.

The duties of the Speaker is both exact and continuous throughout the year, as to various matters requiring attention and over-

The salary of the Ontario Speaker was raised in 1975, the year in which the incumbent, Jack Jones of Ottawa, not only without opposition, but with the approval of members on both sides of the issue.

And now, when the Senator has voluntarily proposed a reduction of his salary to \$1,500 for his twelve months' office, and when the *Chief Magistrate* has paid it, merely for no more than retirement during a period when none was due, appeared the income of \$1,500, tried to make a little political capital for themselves by making it rather of another \$150.

Another highly paid officer is the Chief of the Maritime Division. In 1974 he received \$1,000 a year, nearly double the \$500.75 last month.

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It amounts the first part as "Chief of the Executive Council," an office he holds now, as he did then, with that of Deputy Attorney General.
