MONTREAL HOG MARKET

Montreal, Saturday, Feb. 27.—The market for live hogs is very firm, and prices are steady at the level reached last week. Every day offerings are closed at from 87.35 to 87.50 a pair, for selected lots weighed off cubs. There has been an active demand for these, and stock and sales have been made at about 810.25 a pair for fresh killed abattoir stock. Heavy dressed are quoted at 89.25 to 89.50.

MONTREAL BUTTER MARKET.

The butter market is firm, with prices steady and largely offered. The quality being quoted at 34c a lb., with ordinary grades obtainable at 33c to 33.50c. The supply of Canada butter is rapidly disappearing, and the importations of New Zealand creamery are just sufficient to prevent any further advance in the market. There is a general feeling that prices have reached their limit, and that the next move when it comes will be downward, but it is not probable for some time the advent of new butter in large quantities, of a possible break in the American market is looked upon with some doubt to send butter across the lines at low prices.

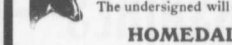
