" and real estates, situate or being within any of the said Plantations, " belonging to any person indebted, shall be liable to, and chargeable " with, all just debts, duties and demands of what nature or kind soe-" ver, owing by any fuch person to His Majesty, or any of His Sub-" jects, and shall and may be affets for the satisfaction thereof, in like " manner as real estates are by the laws of England liable to the satis-" faction of debts due by Bond or other specialty, and shall be subject to " the like remedies, proceedings and process in any court of Law or " Equity, in any of the faid Plantations respectively, for seizing, ex-" tending, felling or disposing of any such Houses, Lands, Negroes, " and other hereditaments and real estates, towards the satisfaction of " fuch debts, duties and demands, and in like manner as personal el-" tates in any of the faid Plantations respectively, are seized, extended, " fold or disposed of for the satisfaction of debts."-Which Statute forms a part of the Laws of the Province under the Quebec Act, whereby all Acts of Parliament before then made, concerning or respecting the said Colonies and Plantations, are declared to be in force within the faid Province of Quebec, and every part thereof.

That by the Statute 30. Geo. III. Chap. 27th, intituled, "An Act " for encouraging new fettlers in His Majesty's Colonies and Plantati-" ons in America," It is enacted, " That from and after the first day of " August, one thousand seven hundred and ninety, if any person or per-" fons, being a subject or subjects of the territories or countries belong-" ing to the United States of America, shall come from thence, toge-" ther with his or their family or families, to any of the Bahama or " Bermuda or Somers Islands, or to any part of the Province of Quebec, " or Nova-Scotia, or any of the territories belonging to His Majesty in " North America, for the purpose of residing and settling there, it shall " be lawful for any fuch person or persons, having first obtained a Li-" cence for that purpose from the Governor, or, in his absence, from " the Lieutenant Governor, of the faid Islands, Colonies or Provinces " respectively, to import into the same, in British ships, owned by His " Majesty's subjects, and navigated according to Law, any Negroes, " Household Furniture, Utenfils of Husbandry, or Cloathing free of "duty." And it is also enacted by the said Act, " That all sales or " Bargains for the fale of any Negro, Household Furniture, Utenfils of " Husbandry, or Cloathing so imported, which shall be made within " Twelve Calendar Months after the Importion of the same, (except
