

ENGLAND AND IRELAND DIVIDE HONORS IN SOCCER AND RUGBY

Rose the Victor at Rugby, but Vanquished by Shamrock at Soccer - King George and Premier Asquith Witness the Former Struggle.

Saturday was a big one in both soccer and rugby circles in the Old Country, for, in addition to the full league schedule, the international teams of England and Ireland were fighting it out in both branches of the sport. Ireland was successful in the soccer game at Middlesboro, beating England by 3 goals to 0, but at Twickenham, where the third international rugby game was played, England won by 17 points to 12. Over 20,000 spectators were in the famous Twickenham enclosure, among whom were King George and Premier Asquith. This makes two wins for England and one for Wales. The first match in the series played January 17 was won by England over Wales and the second match in February 7 by Wales over Scotland.

Old Trafford Team Beaten. The big surprise of the day in the first division is the defeat of Manchester United by Burnley. True it was only a 1 to 0 victory, but it means two points less towards the championship. To make matters worse, the other team from the banks of the Irwell, Manchester City were beaten by the Rovers at Blackburn. The Rovers are now five clear points ahead of their nearest rivals, Sunderland. Everton made no mistake about beating Sheffield United, 5 to 0; it looks more a battle between two first-class British soccer elevens.
