TURKEY'S AIMS NOT RELIGIOUS

Mussulman Empire Has Cut Its Own Throat By Entering War

None of the belligerent nations will fare so badly as Turkey if at the end of the war territory is divided according to the wishes of the inhabitants, for the Turks are, in point of numbers, a small and insignificant minority in European Turkey. This point is emphasized by Dr. A. Mingans in the course of an erudite article on Turkish aims, in the Manchester Guardian. He asserts it to be a fact that Turkish massacres and atrocities committed upon the Armen-

ians and others are not religious, but political. There is no holy flame burning in the breasts of Enver and the other leaders of the Young Turks, but there is a flame for territorial aggrandizement and for oustering all non-Turkish elements in the empire. It is in furtherance of their ambition to make every Turkish citizen a Turk at heart, speak the Turkish language and conform to every Turkish custom that the atrocities have been committed. Not Religion, but Race.

It is only recently that the idea has entered the mind of a Turk that there is a difference between a nation and the religion of that nation. The Arabo-Turkish word for nation and religion is the same; and the Turkish Empire was considered to be divided into the Christian nation and the Moslem nation. The revolution of 1908 was purely a Turkish revolution which was not participated in by the other nationalities in the empire. They were not deceived as to its significance as were most outside

observers, who thought that any movement that ended the reign of Abdul Hamid must be a good movement, and who were deceived by the hypocritical expressions of Enver and his fellow-conspirators. One year after the new Constitution had been adopted a well-informed Patriarch told his suffragans: "We have been delivered from Diodetian to fall into the hands of Julian; may God have mercy on us!" After the revolution the Young Turks took up the campaign to make a Turk of every citizen in the Turkish Empire, that is to say, a Turk in religion and language. Secret societies were formed with a view to establishing constant intercourse with Turanian bodies of Ural-Altaic groups in Caucasus, Trans-Caucasia. War was declared on the use of Arabic and Persian words.

To Make Constantinople a Centre. An attempt was made to make Constantinople the centre of a new system which would bring into motion the Tartars in Northern Persia, Caucasus, Trans-Caspian provinces, Afghanistan, Northern India, Bokhara, Samarkand and Turkestan. A small country barred the way to the realization of this vast plan, and that country was Armenia. Therefore, it was decided to remove Armenia from the map, and that action was taken by the Young Turks. At first they made suggestions. They informed their officials that those who spoke the Turkish language should be given preference in the civil service. Christian schools were supposed to adopt in their curriculum the teaching of Turkish history, and it was broadly hinted that nobody who was not familiar with Turkish history should be given Government employment.

It may be argued that the sentiments of the Young Turks ought to have been taken advantage of by the British instead of by the Germans, and in that connection the controversy has not yet been written. A passage from the address of the Turkish Government, however, is well worth reading:

"How often have the savage Russians, the traitorous English, the Frenchmen, born of impure parentage, yet proud in their baseness, planted their unclean flags upon our pure and holy mountains? How often have they seized you by your lifeless, spiritless feet and hands and rolled you in the mire? Oh, you poor, helpless people of India and of the Oxus, and you wretched tribes of Turkestan, Bukhara and Turkestan, dying under the bloody hand of Russia! Go forth, ye Moslems, in the places of blood and groans! there see the ruined countries of Iran, and let it be a lesson. Read your history! Look at the despised graves of your kings; if you desire honor, and glory, hours and days, behold all are awaiting you. Eternal joys, the shade of green trees, hours, hours are in the grasp of your sword. Cause the minarets and mountains to resound once more with the cry 'Allah! Allah! Holy war! Holy war!' Oh, Moslems, blow the trumpet everywhere!"

The Empire assigned to the Turks by the course of events is, as Dr. Mingans says, essentially un-Turkish. In Arabia, Syria, Mesopotamia and Palestine the Turkish population is like the Jewish population in Toronto. In Armenia and Kurdistan they are out-numbered by at least twenty to one. Only in the vilayets stretching north of Aleppo and Harpoot to Constantinople might it have been said before the war that they formed a little more than half the population. Even in Constantinople they form a minority against all the other nationalities combined. The notion of Enver Bey is that in the event of a triumph of the Central Powers, Germany and Turkey will divide up the world between them. German taking what she wants and Turkey taking what is left. The point to which we wish to draw attention is that Germany and Turkey are inspired by about the same religious motives.

SENTENCE COMMUTED Madrid, July 17.—King Alfonso has been advised by the Spanish minister at Brussels, that a lawyer from Samar, Max Wardo, condemned to death by the German authorities, has had his sentence commuted to imprisonment, thanks to the king's intervention.
