## 51st Diocesan Synod Meets In Fredericton This Week

The fifty-first session of the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton will be held during this week in Fredericton, and it is expected that over 150 delegates will be in attendance. The Synod will open with a celebration of Holy Communion tomorrow morning at Christchurch Cathedral and at this service Bishop Richardson will deliver his charge to the Synod. The first business meeting will be held in the afternoon at the Y. M. C. A. rooms, York street, and in the evening the Synod service will be held at Christchurch Cathedral, the preacher being the Very Rev. Dean of Nova Scotia, Dr. J. D. P. Llywd. The Holy Communion will be celebrated at the Cathedral at 7:30 daily during the Synod. The meeting of the Synod is expected to be a busy one as during the sessions reports will be received from some thirty different boards and committees. The following standing committees and boards will also be appointed: Standing Committee, Executive Committee, Board of Missions, Board of Finance, Board of Church Literature, Board of Education, Standing Committee on Sunday Schools, Corresponding Members of the Sunday School Commission, Sunday School Commission, Governors of King's College, Windsor, Trustees of Girls' School at Windsor, Members of Board of Management of Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada, Committee on Theological Study, Ordination Candidates' Council, Committee on Constitutions and Canons, Committee on Statistics and Statistics, Committee on Memorials to Deceased Members, Social Service Council, Members of the Social Service Council of the Canadian Church, Representative on Board of Maritime Home for Girls, Lay Members of the Board of Discipline, Delegates to the General Synod, and Delegates to the Provincial Synod. Other business to be considered will be the appointment of the next place of meeting and the fixing of the salaries of officers.

Among the matters left over from last year's Synod was the report of a committee on the formation of a Men's Association; a notice of motion for an alteration in Canon 32 was also left over from last year. Three notices of motion have been given for this year, one that the nominations of delegates to the General and Provincial Synods as well as standing committees and boards shall take place on the first day of meeting, and two others dealing with amendments to Canons.


