No date for the meeting of the share holders was fixed.

AFTER AN EXPORT DUTY ON OUR PULP, WOOD

Ottaws, Friday—Hon. J. D. Rol land of Montreal, President of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, was in Ottawa recently interviewing Bir Wilfrid Laurier and other Ministers to urge that the Government legislation be introduced this sesion providing an export duty on pulpwood, and making more adequate provisions for con-serving the forests of Canada., on which largely depends the preserva-tion of the splendid water powers of Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick The Canadian Manufacturers' Association intend to continue urging this question upon the attention of Federal and Provincial Governments unadequate measures are taken to attain the end in view.

Sir Wilfrid expressed his entire sympathy with the views voiced by Hon. Mr. Rolland. It is probable that a Royal Commission will be ap pointed this session to take up the whole question of forest preservation and the concomitant question of prehibiting the export of pulpwood. Parliament would then be next session fully seized of all the facts and needs of the case, and any legislation would be based on the authoritative report of the commission. It is unlikely that any legislation will be passed this session imposing an export duty on

JAPAN TO IMPORT A NUMBER OF **AIRSHIPS**

PARIS, Friday. — The rumor that Japan has acquired a number of renchbuilt airships already, and has ordered half a dozen more for use in onnection with the army and navy, nad been so persistent in Paris last week that I called today at the Japanese Embassy to enquire what was ir. the report. It was there said that the question was the Embassy's military attache, now absent from Paris In this connection I later called upon M. Juliot, chief engineer of the great aeronautic establishment of Messre Lebaudy at Moisson, and asked if he had received any order from the Japanese. M. Juliot smilingly replied that he would rather not be quoted on the subject. He spoke freely, however, as to the role airships will play in any future international conflict. 'Any amateur can see,' said M. Jul-

lot, what an importaant part a steerable balloon can take in military manoeuvres on either land or sea. vould be more successful in seouting and reconnoitering operations than any other system yet devised.
'Moreover, with the present develop-

ment of knowledge in the handling of such craft well in advance of technical improvement, they can even now be used as fearful engines of attack For example, it would be perfectly possible now for a steerable balloon to carry a thousand pounds of ex-plosives and drop them with great accuracy at any given point. Bridges for troops could thus be demoralized at little cost and little danger.
