N. S. TEMPERANCE LEGISLATION

Introduced in the Provincial Legislature.

(Amended Nov. 1)

In the House of Assembly on Tuesday, 11th, Mr. McGeoghegan introduced a bill to amend the Nova Scotia Temperance Act. The bill provides, among other things, that the occupant of any place in which any sale, barter or exchange of liquor is carried on, or in which it is intended to be carried on, shall be personally liable to the penalty of imprisonment prescribed with respect to such sale, barter or exchange, notwithstanding such sale, barter or exchange was made by some other person who cannot be proved to have acted under the direction of such occupant.

Proof of the fact of such sale, barter or exchange shall be presumed in any case where such sale, barter or exchange was made in a place where such sale, barter or exchange is prohibited, and the burden of proof shall be upon the defendant.

Whenever, in any place where liquor is sold, contrary to the Nova Scotia Temperance Act, any person has drunk to excess of liquor furnished to him, and while in a state of intoxication from such drinking has come to his death by suicide or drowning, or perishing from cold or other accident occasioned by such intoxication, the keeper of such place and also any other person, for him, or in his employ, delivered to such person the liquor whereby such intoxication was caused shall be liable to an action for personal wrong at the suit of the legal representatives of the deceased person, if such action is brought within three months after such death and may recover such sum, not less than \$100 and not more than \$1,000 in the aggregate of any such action.

If any person in a state of intoxication assaults any person or injures any property, the person who furnishes him with the liquor which caused such intoxication, if such furnishing was in violation of law, shall be liable to the same action as the person intoxicated is liable to.

Any constable can be employed by the inspector-in-chief. The latter may cause an enquiry into the conduct of any inspector.

On information signed by ten or more ratepayers certifying that the N. S. Temperance Act is unenforced in any municipality, it shall be the duty of the inspector-in-chief to investigate the complaint.

SPECIAL SESSION FOR MARRIAGE CASE

Delay in Judgment in "Companies Case" May Defer Reference Concerning Amendment to Marriage Law.

Ottawa, May 7.—At the opening of the May term of the Supreme Court today Chief Justice Sir Chas. Fitzpatrick announced that in view of the fact that the British privy council had not yet given judgment in the "companies case," which will determine the right of the Dominion to submit a stated case in a matter affecting provincial law, the reference concerning the act to amend the marriage act would be deferred. If the privy council judgment is given during the present sitting of the Supreme Court, the marriage law reference will be taken up at once. If delayed till later, a special session of the Supreme Court will probably be called.
