Two leprosy cases reported some time ago at Cape Breton are said to be at Lake O'Leary, N. E. Margaree. It is supposed that the disease was brought there from Newfoundland many years ago. The worst case at present is said to be that of a young lady who contracted it while waiting upon and reading to her uncle, who was a leper.

A cloud burst across the border at Chatham, N. Y., on Saturday last and washed away the earthworks of the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg railway. A great train disaster would have occurred had not an old woman signalled a stop. The brakes brought the train to a standstill a few feet from the washout.

We have received the "Dominion Illustrated" of the 25th of June, which is a very interesting number, containing much good reading matter, and a number of beautiful illustrations, among them being the "Falls of the River St. John," "Old Fort Point," "Inauguration Ceremony, Lake St. John Railway," "Sketches in British Columbia," and a view of Banff and the National Park.

The Bazaar in aid of the Convent de Notre Dame opens in the Market Hall at 2 o'clock to-day, and will continue this evening as well as to-morrow afternoon and evening. As the ferry steamer Alexander was crossing from Morrisville to Rockville, Ont., on the 28th ult., with four loads of coal and a few passengers, the boat sprang a leak and sank in 80 feet of water. The men jumped into the river, and were all saved except C. C. McCall, agent of the Delaware and Hudson Railway at Montreal, who has not been seen since the accident, and is supposed to have been lost.

The closing exercises of the Rustico Cross School came off on Friday last, in the presence of twenty-three parents and visitors. The examination was conducted by Dr. Gallant, James Fleming and Messrs. Gallant, which was highly satisfactory. At the close a very warm compliment was paid their popular teacher, Mr. Peter D. McGuigan, who has carefully conducted this school for the past two years.—COS.

Is the French Chamber of Deputies on Saturday last, Pluchon questioned the Government concerning a letter a Journalist named Westmore wrote M. Meyer, suggesting the forging of documents implicating the Government in the Credit Mobilier frauds. In the discussion which followed, De Cuesnesse declared the letters forged, and named Westmore, Minister of Justice, as being Meyer's accomplice. De Cuesnesse was censured by the President and expelled from the Chamber.

On Thursday morning, says the Halifax Herald, a pair of horses driven by Wm. Purcell, of the 3 mile house, nearly fell from a train on the cotton factory siding, near Newington. The pair of horses, in jumping the wagon to get out of the horse's line, fell on the ground, badly bruising the pair of horses.
