## Household Hints.

**Rice Griddle Cake.**—One quart of sweet milk, three eggs, two cups of sifted flour, one tablespoonful of melted butter, as much soft-boiled rice as you like.

**Johnny-cake.**—Two-thirds of a teaspoonful of soda, three tablespoonfuls of sugar, one teaspoonful of cream of tartar, one egg, one teaspoonful of sweet milk, two teaspoonfuls of Indian meal, three three-tablespoonfuls of flour and a little salt.

**Waffles Without Eggs.**—A tablespoonful of lard put into a tureen of corn meal, pour scalding water on it until it is thick as mush; put into the one part of lard, one part of meal, and one part of water, and one of flour; bake in waffle-iron.

**Creamed Parsnips.**—Boil tender, scrape, and slice lengthwise. Put over the fire with two tablespoonfuls of butter, pepper and salt, and a little minced parsley. Shake until the mixture boils. Dish the parsnips, add in the sauce three tablespoonfuls of flour, boil one, and pour over the parsnips.

**Sugar Mountain Cake.**—Two cupsful sugar, half cupful butter, four eggs, one cupful milk, two cupsful flour. Beat the butter and sugar together, then add the yolks of the eggs and the milk, then the flour, and lastly the whites of the eggs whipped to a froth. Beat altogether and bake in White Mountain-cake tins.

**Virginia Corn Pie.**—Take one heaping cupful of boiled hominy, heat it, and stir in a tablespoonful of butter, three eggs, and one cup of sweet milk. Add as much cornmeal as will serve to thicken it till it is like the batter of Johnny-cake. Bake in a quick oven.

**Apple Sauce for Stew.**—Bake six apples very soft, remove the skins and beat the soft apple with the white of an egg until quite stiff, add also, a cup of sugar while beating, and flavor with any essence you desire.

**Cabbage.**—Boil the cabbage gently until cooked, and drain it; put two cups of butter into a saucepan, set it on a good fire, and when melted, put in the cabbage with some salt and pepper; add half a pint of cream and milk, and one teaspoonful of flour, stir constantly with a wooden spoon. Simmer until the sauce is reduced, and serve hot.

**A Nutritious Broth.**—A quarter of a teaspoonful of beef extract, the yolk of an egg beaten up, a cup of boiling water, a little salt added and served with a slice of hot toast, makes a palatable and nutritious luncheon, and an excellent rest for invalids.

**Tomato Soup.**—To one quart of boiling water add one quart of tomatoes; boil again and put in one teaspoonful of soda; as soon as it has ceased foaming, add one pint of milk, four rolled crackers, butter, pepper and salt, and serve very hot.

**Ginger Bread.**—One cup of molasses, one cup of boiling water, one tablespoonful of lard, one teaspoonful of baking powder, one teaspoonful of ginger, two cups of flour.

**Cooking Without Eggs or Milk.**—Two teaspoonfuls of light brown sugar rolled fine with rolling pin, one teaspoon of soda, one of water, one teaspoonful of soda, dissolved in water, mix and roll thin, cut out and bake quickly; as much in baking as making.

**Potato Croquettes.**—Pare, boil, and mash smoothly about six good-sized potatoes. Add one tablespoon of hot rich milk or cream, and whites of two eggs well beaten, salt and pepper to taste. When cool enough to handle work into shape, roll in egg and bread crumbs, and fry in nice, wholesome hot lard.

**"Conching"** is a very effective form of needlework, and the title may be applied to all forms of embroidery in which threads of crevel, silk or gold are laid on the surface to be ornamented and stitched on it by threads coming from the back of the material. Conching outlines nowadays are unusually thick strands of double crevel, flosselle, silk cords, or gold thread, used to finish the edges of applique, or in gold outline work. These strands, cords or threads are caught down at regular intervals either by silks or fine gold thread.

**Red Rice.**—Take one and one-half pints of red currants and one-half pint of red raspberries. Put them into an earthen dish and set inside a kettle of boiling water until the fruit is broken and the juice runs freely. Strain off the juice, which may then be diluted with one part water to two of juice if desired. Sweeten to taste; and for each pint of the juice, when boiling, stir into it two tablespoonfuls of ground rice, or rice flour rubbed smooth in a little of the

juice which may be retained for the purpose. Turn into molds, let cool, and served with whipped cream.

**Potato Salad.**—Use potatoes which have been boiled for the table. Slice thin six or eight potatoes into a glass dish. Take half of a white onion and cut into the smallest possible pieces, and strew between the sliced potatoes. When the dish is full let it stand while you make the dressing, which is made of two eggs, the yolks in a bowl with a small teaspoonful of ground mustard, one of white sugar, teaspoonful of salt, one-quarter teaspoonful of black pepper. Put a large cup of vinegar in the saucepan with butter size of an egg, when melted, stir slowly into it the egg yolks, and when all is in pour over the sliced potatoes.
