Representative Rodenbery of Georgia, who has introduced legislation in congress forbidding intermarriage of lacks and whites, sent word today o local federal officials asking for a unscript of the testimony in the se. Mr. Rodenbery said he intend-to use the story developed in the hinson trial to show that relations tween the races are impossible. between the races are impossible.
Johnson is crushed at the realization that the conviction might send
him to prison. The negro said he
had been broken financially and had
spent about \$50,000 in his defense.
Johnson's attorney declared that if
Judge Carpenter refused a new trial
he would carry the case to the supreme court

preme court.

"This verdict will go around the world." said the presecutor. "It is the forerunner of laws to be passed in the United States which we may live to see. Laws forbidding miscegnation. This negro, in the eyes of many, has been persecuted. Perhaps, as an individual he was, but his misfortune is to be the foremost example of the evil in permitting the intermarriage of whites and blacks. He has violated the law. Now it is his function to teach others the law must be respected."
