

In 1849 this institution was thrown open to all denominations, and received the name of the Toronto University, which now numbers between 3,000 and 4,000 students Kingston has even a more startling record. Queen's has between 1,300 and 1,400 students. It has been estimated at a low figure, that these students alone are worth to the city about \$5,000
