WHY AIRSHIP EXPLODED

Expert Explains the Cause of Tragedy at Atlantic City. [Canadian Press.] Atlantic City, N. J., July 13 .- The

explosion of the gas envelope of Melvin Vaniman's airship here on July 2, which caused the death of its crew of five men, was due, not to the action of the sun's rays, as at first supposed, but to a fault in construction, which allowed the expanding gas to exhaust directly over the exhaust of the propeller engines, thus igniting This is the conclusion reached by Charles Hillman, an expert, who has just concluded an investigation of the

Mr. Hillman made an examination of the Vaniman balloon on June 15, and one of the first things that struck his notice was the arrangement of the six exhaust valves in envelope, by means of which the gas, when it began to expand, was allowed to escape. This was Vaniman's invention to prevent ac-cident. These valves, according to Mr. Hillman, were placed three either side of the envelope in a horizontal line slightly on the lower side of the bag. Four of the valves, he says, were located directly over the exhaust of the propellers.

Consequently, when any one of the valves was opened, the rush of gas quickly come into contact with the exhaust and the hydrogen would be ignited. This theory, Mr. Hillman thinks, is borne out by the fact that one of the exhaust valves, which has been found, was smoked, showing signs of the explosion.
