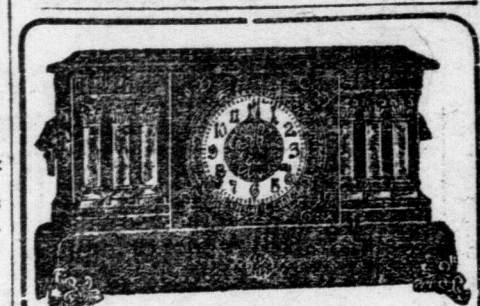

REPORT ON CONVENTION
Mrs. Wyckoff Tells St. James Branch of A. Y. P. A. Session.

While that had its place in the activities of the association, he felt that it would be well in future to try to place more emphasis on the more serious aspect of the work.

HOMES ARE FOUND FOR 84 ORPHANS DURING THE YEAR

Splendid Period For Protestant Orphans' Home Reported at Annual Meeting.

ALL CHILDREN ARE WELL Not a Death Occurred During Year, Though There Was Outbreak of Measles.

Reports of a most encouraging nature were received at the thirty-sixth annual meeting of the board of the Protestant Orphans' Home, held in that institution Monday afternoon. The meeting was largely attended, and the year's progress was viewed with great satisfaction.
The secretary's report, read by Miss Stevenson, showed that 176 children were cared for in the institution during the twelve months. Of these 84 were adopted into good homes. There were no deaths, and very little sickness, an epidemic of measles being about the only illness occurring.
Miss Stevenson reported that the heating system, which was installed last year through the untiring efforts of Mrs. Becher, had been cleared of debt. The announcement was received with applause.

Will Put in Electricity.
The report recommended the installation of electric light throughout the building in place of the present system which is deemed inadequate. Fitting reference was made to the death of ex-Ald. George W. Armstrong. "We regret very much the death of our worthy member, Mr. G. W. Armstrong," said Miss Stevenson. "He was ever ready to assist us at any time, especially at Christmas."
The thanks of the board were extended to the solicitor, Mr. E. W. M. Flock, the matron Miss Auld, the doctors, the advisory board, the Busy Bees and the press.
The efforts of Mrs. Gregston and the Busy Bees in providing Christmas entertainment for the children, were especially appreciated.

Dr. J. S. Niven presented the report of the physicians. The year was a most successful one as far as the health of the inmates was concerned, he said. Referring to the epidemic of measles, Dr. Niven stated that he had found the infirmary, which had been fitted up at the time, a most useful adjunct to the home.
Praise for Staff.
"The matron and attendants performed their duties in a most satisfactory manner," the report concluded. The treasurer's report, presented by Mrs. Gregston, showed receipts for the year amounting to \$4,871.02, and expenditures of \$4,636.06, leaving a balance on hand of \$234.96. This amount included \$200 transferred from the donation fund. Receipts from the endowment fund amounted to \$1,461.32.
All the officers of the past year were unanimously re-elected. They are as follows: President, Mrs. Becher; vice-president, Mrs. J. W. G. Winnet; Mrs. Edge, Mrs. Zeigler, and Mrs. Fowler; secretary, Miss A. S. Stevenson; assistant secretary, Miss M. Mann; treasurer, Mrs. Gregston; auditors Mrs. Bowman and Mr. E. W. M. Flock; patronesses, Mrs. A. Thompson, Mrs. George Robinson and Mrs. E. De la Hooke.
In the unavoidable absence of Mr. Flock, the chair at the meeting was taken by Dr. W. J. Stevenson.
Refreshments were served at the close of the meeting, which was one of the best in the history of the board.

Mr. Soldan had just completed a fine cement stable under his barn, which had all modern conveniences. The cause of the fire is unknown. The loss is estimated at \$8,700, and he carries \$1,700 insurance in the Hay Mutual. The stock and implements were saved.
